GOLF - THE BANDA TROPHY

The resurrection of The Banda Trophy was held at Karen Country Club on Monday 30th January. Karen Club allowed us to use their club house facilities and course free of charge as they have done on 5 previous occasions, to help promote Junior Golf in the country.

We had 8 schools taking part in our competition with a total of 56 players. The event is played over 9 holes using a Stableford method of scoring. Each team was made up of 4 players and the best 3 scores counted for the final tally. There were some remarkable individual scores of 26 points on the back 9 from Kenton and Peponi players. (18 Stableford points is considered a good score and anything higher is very good indeed).

When all the cards were in and checked scrupulously, the final results were quite tight;

In third place were Kenton with 56 points, The Banda were second with 58 and Peponi House took the competition with a total of 59 stableford points. I must mention Captain Jesse Frost. He led from the front coming in with a brilliant 27 points followed by Ayaan with 16 and Otto with 15. Sahib was the fourth member of our first team. Our second team was made up of Jake, Shayan, David and Nakami, who fired an impressive 17 points.

I would also like to thank all the parents who managed to make the trip to Karen and support our team. I believe that our future does look bright as 4 of the 8 players are Year 7 boys who can only get better with time and practice.




BEYOND BANDA BORDERS

Year 8 Girls' Empowerment Project : Fighting for Women's Dignity

The Year 8 girls have been discussing women's rights and how the lives of women and girls in Kenya are affected every day by not having access to basic necessities. This led to a conversation with special guest Marian Lawrence about DIGNITY and the girls are fired up to do what they can to help.

Did you know?

- 60% of women in Kenya cannot afford sanitary products and will often resort to sharing pads or making their own from old cloth, leaves, feathers or even dried dung.

- Underwear is considered a luxury and many girls and women do not own knickers. This leaves them vulnerable to attack or ridicule, susceptible to infections and without adequate protection when menstruating.
- Many girls will miss up to 25% of their secondary education due to not being adequately protected when menstruating.



We think this is unfair. Unfairness makes us angry. Anger makes us want to do something about it.

Arwa: "This is something that all women go through, but we can't all deal with it in the same ways. Dignity is a right, not a luxury."

Leti: "It's not fair that access to basic necessities isn't available to everyone. In this community, we can help."

Hena: "The statistics are very concerning. It's important that more people know about this and we do what we can to help."

Sabrina: "Girls' education is being severely affected by something that can be so easily solved. We want to erase the embarrassment and get people talking about this."

Introducing 'Fighting for Women's Dignity' (FWD).

Ladies and girls of The Banda community, if - like us - you have far too many pairs of knickers in your drawers but you don't know what to do with them all, we finally have an answer for you!

Year 8 girls are collecting:

- Old (CLEAN) underwear - Knickers and bras. It doesn't matter what colour/style/size. It doesn't matter if they're not in pristine condition any more! They just have to be clean, and they will be greatly appreciated.



- Sanitary products - pads, tampons, period cups. - Tote bags or old reusable shopping bags.



- Volunteer time - if you would like to help pack the donations, please let us know and we'll get in touch.

With the donations, we will create Dignity Packs, containing several sets of underwear, sanitary products and an information booklet (in English and Kiswahili). These will be distributed at first to girls and women in Kibera through The Banda's links with KIMMTA. As the project expands, we will hopefully be able to cast this net wider.

Donations should be brought to Mrs Sweetnam's classroom. Everything will be greatly appreciated.

After the half term break, we will launch fundraising activities with a view to raising money to make reusable pads to be distributed alongside the Dignity Packs.

Thank you to Marian Lawrence for getting us fired up, and many thanks for The Banda community's support.

In Geography, Year 6 are learning how to interpret Ordnance Survey maps this term. 
LOWER SCHOOL - PLANET WARRIORS

TOMATO SOUP





Ingredients

- 6 tomatoes
- ¼ teaspoon brown sugar
- 1/4 teaspoon salt or to your taste
- 8 pieces basil leaves
- 1 tablespoon butter
- ½ teaspoon ground black pepper
- 1 onion chopped
- 1 tablespoon cornstarch
- 750ml water

Method

- Wash and blanch tomatoes in 200ml water for 8 minutes
- Remove tomatoes from water and keep aside
- · In a saucepan melt butter add the chopped onion and cook for 3 minutes
- · Add the brown sugar and cook for 1 more minute
- Add blanched tomatoes, basil leaves, salt and pepper, cornstarch to the cooked onions and let it simmer for 10
 minutes on low heat.
- · Remove from heat and blend the mixture till all is emulsified
- Heat the 550ml water
- Turn the blended mixture into saucepan and add the hot water slowly to your required thickness cooking on medium heat for another 10 minutes on low heat.

Serving

Serve as a starter with croutons.


