Then we had a go at being actors and directors. We watched each other carefully and gave advice on how to make our performances stronger.






## YEAR 3


#### Ingredients


- · 2 cups all-purpose flour
- 2 teaspoons baking soda
- 2 eggs
- · 2 teaspoons ground cinnamon
- 1/2 teaspoon salt
- 3/4 cup vegetable oil
- · 2 cups each blended carrots & zucchini

- 1/2 teaspoon grated nutmeg
- 11/4 cups brown sugar
- 1 teaspoon lemon juice
- 1/4 cup raisins

#### Method

- Combine all of the dry ingredients.
- Beat the eggs with the oil and add to the flour mixture
- Add to this the carrots, zucchini, lemon and raisins
- Pour into 2 greased 8 x 4 loaf pans. Bake at 175°C for about 60 minutes or until a toothpick comes out clean
- Cool in tin for around 15 minutes before turning out to cool on a wire rack


