



LOWER SCHOOL - YEAR 4

In Science, the children created simple circuits. Year 4 also attended a super and interactive workshop with author, Ginny Larby. Spelling is so much fun when we get to go outside and gather sticks, leaves and whatever else we think will work to practise our weekly words. We worked in partners to 'write' our words! This week we have started to read different Ancient Greek myths. We reviewed the features of a myth and then worked in groups to create different parts of a class myth. Teamwork at its greatest in Literacy.

The children learnt about the different food groups and discussed how each food group is required for a balanced meal. We then went on to sample a variety of different foods from the different groups.

Ingredients

- 6 slices white bread
- 1/4 cup chocolate chips
- 2 1/2 cups cold milk

- 5 tablespoons soft unsalted butter
- 1/4 cup castor sugar

- 1/2 cup sultanas
- 2 large eggs

Method

- Place the bread slices on a board and spread a thick layer of butter
- · Cut the slices into 4 triangular pieces and keep aside
- Beat the eggs well and pour into cold milk. Mix well and keep aside
- Grease an ovenproof dish with butter and place one layer of buttered bread slices, sprinkle, sultanas, chocolate
 chips and sugar, repeat the layers same way till all bread slices are used up
- Pour the egg and milk mixture evenly and leave to stand for 15 minutes
- Bake in medium hot oven for 30 minutes or until top is golden brown and crisp

Serve hot with custard


